Participating Merchants Colorado Springs

- 1. **Rock Ledge Ranch** is located at 3105 Gateway Road. This quilt block, *Apple Tree*, represents an apple tree on the property that was planted by the Chambers family in the late 1800's when they resided in the home standing on the property.
- 2. **Ruth's Stitchery** is located at 4440 Austin Bluffs Pkwy. Ruth Warren Johnson (the owner) grew up in Nebraska, the daughter of a farmer, and recently married a Nebraska farmer from the same community. Hence, the pattern <u>Farmer's Daughter</u> is a personal choice of the owner.
- 3. Ladybug Hill Quilts is located at 929 E. Fillmore, opened in June 2002. The true Lovers Knot (or True Love Knot) is a name which has been used for many distinct knots. The association of knots with the symbolism of love, friendship and affection dates back to antiquity. Dedicated to our quilting community both local and international, Ladybug Hill Quilts is the premier Colorado quilt shop for block of the month programs, Fun & friends!
- 4. **High Country Quilts**, 4771 N. Academy Blvd. opened in 1983. The Pine Tree & Mountains have always been our logo as well as close to our hearts. The pattern *Norway Pine* is most fitting.
- 5. **City of Colorado Springs,** City Administration Building, 30 S. Nevada Ave. The City inhabited this building in 1982. Various city agencies are housed in this building, including the mayor's office. The *Pinwheel* block was chosen because it represents a simple block which is not only inspired by a real object, but is also whimsical and playful.
- Na-La's Quilt Shoppe, 117 S. Main St. in Fountain is housed in the 1898 mercantile building. Two sisters merged their love of fabric and thread, creating a perfect balance. This block, <u>Na-La's Star</u> was designed by one of the owners, Nani Kaai.

Old Colorado City

- 7. **The Green Valley Weavers & Knitters**, 2115 W. Colorado Ave. is a great place to get your knit or weave on. Come knit, spin, weave or crochet with friendly people. Yarns & lessons are available. The owner just loves the flowers in the *Water Lily*.
- 8. Needleworks by Holly Berry and Holly Berry House, 2409 West Colorado Ave, share space in a 130 year old building that once was a Tackle Shop with hay and feed sold outback, upstairs a Boarding House with multitude of small rooms and outside entrance. For 34 years it was the Old Town Bike Shop. Holly Berry has been at this location 17 years with Needleworks by Holly Berry joining them two years later. They have worked with many artists over the past twenty years. Since both shops have Christmas articles year round, the Christmas Star was most appropriate.

- 9. **The Holly Leaf,** 2514 West Colorado Ave., is 90% Christmas 100% of the time! Family owned and operated in Old Colorado City for 26 years. The block *Wind Blown Tulips* was singled out because the owner just liked the looks of tulips in a ring.
- 10. Mya Bella Cupcakes, 2524 ½ W. Colorado Ave., a mother/daughter owned business named after her daughter Mya Bella. The business specializes in gourmet cupcakes for events of all kinds and has been in business for 6 years. The block, Wreath of Carnations, was selected because they loved the flowers and the block was in the stores colors.
- 11. **45 Degree** At 2528-B West Colorado Ave., you will find this quaint shop. In February 2010, with over 11 years of experience, Reed Fair decided to exchange the skyscrapers of Chicago for the mountains near Colorado Springs. Whether you're custom framing your favorite band poster, cherished sports jersey, family portrait or fine are original, your items will be handled with extreme care and professionalism. *The Double Pinwheel* block caught my eye because it was shown in orange, a favorite color.
- 12. **Nana's Quilt Shop**, 35 South 26th St., this quilt block, *Spider* was inspired by a quilt made in the 1930s-40s by our maternal grandmother, Kate Estrander. She made it from scraps of clothing so each block is a different color. It was finished by her daughter, Dora Anderson, who gave it to my sister, Bonnie Bergman. We emphasize learning new and basic sewing skills; with Team and Talents teaching children's classes. Our motto is: *Get Creative at Nana's*.
- 13. **Quilter's Gift Shop**, 2506 Robinson started an online shop in 2010, and then opened retail space in their warehouse in 2012. No fabric, no patterns, no notion, just great gifts for quilters. *The Fox & Geese* block just inspired to show off our building.

- 14. **Tweeds Fine Furnishings**, 240 E. Hwy. 24. Carrying all the finest and most unique items, Tweeds brings you the warmth and comfort that is *Black Spruce*.
- Andrews Candies, 19251 E. US Hwy 24. Andrews Candies - 58 years of handmade brittle goodness! Ships Worldwide. Their block is called <u>Sugar Bowl</u>.
- 16. **Vectra Bank Colorado**, 361 Midland Ave. Proactive relationship banking where locally focused, engaged, and expert bankers work to anticipate the needs of their clients sets Vectra Bank apart. Their block is called *Fair and Square*.
- 17. **Park State Bank**, 710 West Hwy 24. Vision: to become the leading community bank. We look forward to building relationships that meet customer needs and help them reach their goals...with Free Trade. Their block is called <u>Fair Trade</u>.

- 18. **Brenda's Boutique**, 102 E. Midland Ave. Brenda's Boutique and Consignments is an upscale resale store. We feature brands like Chico's, Coldwater Creek and Brighton. Shop here for a personal shopping experience. Their block is called <u>Best Friend</u>.
- 19. **Cowbells Western Interiors**, 214 E. Midland Ave. "Outfitting your home in the rustic refined elegance of the West". Their block is called <u>Buffalo Ridge</u>.
- 20. **Vintage Vines**, 108 W. Midland Ave. A nice place to browse unique treasures, enjoy a glass of wine or just relax with a cup of tea. Their block is called <u>Cups and Saucers</u>.
- 21. **Studio West**, 216 W. Midland Ave. Studio West has been an all-natural Aveda Salon & Spa since 1997. Along with exceptional services, they offer an all-original art boutique & Colorado craft beers and wines. Their block is called *Gentleman's Fancy*.
- 22. Carmen, A Tapas Grill & Bar, 609 W. Midland Ave. Tapas: a wide variety of small flavorful appetizers meant to shared and savored with friends. Designed to encourage conversation and traditionally accompanied by wine. Their block is called <u>Right Hand of Friendship</u>.
- 23. **Kelly's Office Connection**, 623 W. Midland Ave. Gail & Tim Taylor bought the office supply store in 2004. They have expanded the services and remodeled the store. Kelly's provides wonderful customer service! Their block is called *Envelope*.
- 24. **Home Improvements, LLC**, 623 W. Midland Ave. Tim started out building homes. He has worked in the movie and TV industry building sets. He is now building decks, remodeling and painting/staining. Their block is called *Handy Andy*.
- 25. **Nuts 'N' Bolts Needlework**, 200 S. Chestnut St. I think stars are fun and rimantic, so that is the reason I chose the <u>Eccentric Star</u> block. Nuts 'N' Bolts is your Colorado destination for quality quilting and sewing supplies, fabric, yarn, notions, embroidery floss, patterns, books and more.
- 26. **Woodland Veterinary Clinic**, 550 E. Chester Ave. Dr. Conrad provides your pet with caring and compassionate medical care. From wellness exams, vaccinations, advanced diagnostics and complex surgical procedures you pet receives high quality care. Their block is called *Black Lab*.
- 27. **NAPA**, 300 Laurel St. The oldest parts distribution company in the U.S. NAPA is the only independently owned and local parts store in Woodland Park. Supplier to repair shops and individual customers with competitive prices. Their block is called *Wrench*.
- 28. **Bad Rock Automotive**, 2701 Mountain Glen Ct. The only AAA approved auto repair facility in Teller County. Service and repairs for all make and models. Exceptional Service. Their block is called *Rocky Road*.
