Food service is available for groups of 12 or more people unless another guest group of 12 or more are already eating meals. All meals will be served for the summer season (June 1st through August 1st).

Discounts

CHILDREN'S RATES - Age 3-11: ½ price; 2 & younger: FREE - (lodging & meals only)

EXTENDED STAY – four nights and longer, 15% discount (lodging & meals).

OFF-SEASON – Call for available discounts for stays between October & May.

LAST MINUTE – Call for available discounts if able to come the "last minute."

Finance Policy

CANCELLATION of this agreement any time within three months prior to the reservation date, requires payment of 80% of the total cost (guaranteed minimum applies to Main Camp, Emmental and Park Ridge facilities only).

DEPOSITS received will be applied toward payment of fees and are non-refundable unless notice of cancellation is given at least three months prior to reservation date AND if another guest group is found to rent the facility.

MEAL CANCELLATIONS- Guests will be financially responsible for meal cancellations within 24 hours of meal time.

Guidelines

⇒ PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT is important to Rocky Mountain Mennonite

Camp to preserve the beauty of its mountain setting. Use of the surrounding Pike National Forest land is dependant on the observance of Forest Service regulations. Camp Guidelines include Forest Service Regulations

⇒ FLOWERS &

TREES should be left as you found them for you and others to enjoy.

⇒ BIRDS & ANIMALS are wonderful to see and enjoy. Please leave them undisturbed.

⇒ STREAMS & POND recreation (kayaks, etc.) is on an “at your own risk” basis, so please supervise young children. Also please help us keep the streams and pond as clean as possible.

⇒ ROCKS should be left where they are. Please do not roll or throw them anywhere (especially into the pond).

⇒ FRAGILE HILLSIDES are best protected by staying on established trails and roadways when hiking to prevent increased erosion.

⇒ LITTER should be put in trash receptacles to maintain the natural beauty of the mountains.

⇒ CAMPFIRES are allowed only in established fire rings. To help prevent forest fires, never leave a campfire unattended and ensure that the fire is completely put out with water.

⇒ MOTOR VEHICLES are only permitted by the Forest Service on the two main roads in the Camp area. On Camp property (and roads), four wheelers and dirt bikes are not permitted due to noise and camper and guest safety.

⇒ NOISE should be kept to a minimum after 11:00 p.m. in consideration to other guest groups who share the camp premises.

⇒ FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT of the camp should be left in good condition. Please notify staff of anything that is broken or needs repair. Repair or replacement of camp property damaged or lost by carelessness is the financial responsibility of guest groups.

⇒ CLEANING: When you end your stay, please put everything back as you found it (recreations equipment, table & chairs, etc.), gather trash, wash dishes (if any), and take all personal belongings home!

Come Stay With Us!

1. Schedule a date – Contact the camp for available dates and facilities. Reservations are available at least 3 years in advance.

2. Rental agreement – A rental agreement will be sent to the group contact person stating the terms of the reservation one year prior to arrival date. For reservations scheduled more than one year in advance a confirmation will be sent with the dates and terms.

3. Rental deposit – For Main Camp, Campground, Emmental Retreat Center, and Park Ridge accommodations, 25% of the estimated total is due 30 days after receipt of the rental agreement. For ridge accommodations, a 50% housing deposit is due.

4. Prior to arrival – Inform the RMMC office of the number of guests attending and confirm food service (if any selected) **two weeks** prior to the arrival date. Also review the guidelines of RMMC and communicate them to all group members.

5. Upon arrival – Check in at the office before proceeding to your accommodations and pass along:

- Correct number in group
- Any meal plan changes or corrections
- Method and time of payment
- Any AV equipment or other details

6. During your stay – Comply faithfully with the camp policies and guidelines (ie: no pets please!) and assume all risk of personal injury and property loss or damage. Areas for rock climbing, rappelling, and fishing are available if your group provides equipment and supervision.

7. Upon departure – Check out at the office before departing.

- Settle all financial arrangements
- Return facility keys
- Notify office of group's departure
